## CCPS FY20 Budget Updates

## Awareness, Education, & Advocacy

Caroline County Public Schools kicked off the FY20 Budget season in October 2018 with each department and school location submitting budget needs for the 19-20 school year. Each request was supported by data and aligned with Pathways 2022 (strategic plan).

The Superintendent's Budget
Advisory Committee and numerous
stakeholder groups (School Board,
Senior Staff, Teachers, Admin.,
Support Staff, Faith Leaders)
prioritized all 58 budget requests
into three categories: mandatory,
critical need, and desired/other.

The vast majority of the budget requests were related to personnel and resources in direct support of instruction and social-emotional learning and mental health. The requests also included implementation of Phase II of the salary/compensation study completed in FY18.

The data from the CCPS advisory committees and the budget prioritization process will guide the development of the FY20 needs based budget. Additionally, the Governor will release his entire budget bill on December 18 which will provide greater details regarding state funding.

## Governor's Budget Proposal

Governor Northam recently proposed a \$268.7M increase in education spending. The proposal was welcomed by the state education community as the average Richmond region teacher salary of \$51,064 is far less than the state average of \$56,861 and the national average of \$58,353. The budget must still pass the General Assembly and the 5% raise is contingent on a local funding match that will be detailed when the Governor releases his full budget on December 18.
